Economic Mobility and Health Policy Project – Advance community health in Colorado through research, outreach, advocacy and strategic communication on the intersecting economic forces affecting health infrastructure and the health of Coloradans and their communities.

Improving Access and Retention for Health Coverage Programs – Improve access to and retention of health coverage programs for low-income families and families facing barriers to care by supporting a statewide network of assisters and advocating for state policy and systems improvements.

Take Care - Health Matters – Improve access to health care for the over 120,000 justice-involved people in Colorado and their families through ongoing education, advocacy and training.

Colorado Health Network's Medical Clinic – Support the launch of a medical clinic to provide integrated and comprehensive services to people living with HIV at a single location in Denver. Services will include medical care, dental care, case management services, adherence monitoring, mental health services, substance use treatment and emergency financial assistance.

Family, Infant and Toddler Program Family Navigator – Expand and grow the successes of the Family, Infant and Toddler (FIT) Program to include play-and-learn groups facilitated by the family navigator, serving children with special needs in low-income, Spanish-speaking families.

Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters Expansion – Expand the Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) program into two additional Colorado communities to promote school readiness, parenting skills, attachment, child development and parent involvement.

Park County School-Based Health Center Implementation Project – Implement a new school-based health center in Fairplay to provide essential primary care, oral health and behavioral health services to students, their families and school staff.

Family Engagement and Youth Well-Being Program – Use the Trust-Based Relational Intervention framework to enhance youth social and emotional health while working with parents to enhance family connections in a low-income, primarily refugee community in Denver.

Mental Health Support in Early Care Settings – Support early childhood mental health consultant to provide mental health services and education for children, families and staff. Implement Conscious Discipline curriculum and provide mental health training to build staff capacity to promote social and emotional development in children.

Runaway and Homeless Youth Mental Health Program – Reduce youth homelessness by providing a continuum of services that moves youth from the streets or temporary shelter to stable, permanent housing and/or family reunification.

Fortaleciendo Familias (Strengthening Families) – Provide mental health services to approximately 450 Latino individuals, strengthen outreach efforts and build organizational capacity under new leadership.

Developing Trauma and PTSD Treatment – Improve behavioral health services for low-income, primarily Spanish-speaking patients in the metro Denver area through implementation of a screening tool and treatment model for trauma.

Behavioral Health Parity in Colorado – Work to ensure behavioral health parity and promote the integration of physical and behavioral health in public and private insurance in Colorado. Integrated Care and Behavioral Health Clinical Training – Increase access to comprehensive behavioral health services through integrated, co-located and community-based care. Support the Behavioral Health Clinical Training program, preparing interns and recently graduated practitioners for mental health practice across settings.
